Trading Zones with Sociology of Transport:

e.g. Concept of 'Motility':

- as the ability to be mobile without necessarily performing movement, whether physical (transport) or virtual (telecommunication)
- Motility conjoins mobility with its opposite, immobility, to capture the range of capacities for movement


